FlexSus is the decision system for the state of the art technology for sustainable and circular infrastructure platform, called ECHO, that has been put together for this programme. It's a mix of energy generation and storage, water generation and storage and sewage. Best of all, it's a modular container based solution aimed at off-grid sites. Placed above ground, once a project is finished, ECHO can be moved elsewhere.

SDEP's collaborative approach also extends beyond the borders of COMESA. The initiative has garnered interest from nations such as Angola and São Tomé and Príncipe, despite their non-membership in COMESA. This openness reflects SDEP's commitment to regional cooperation and its aspiration to serve as a model for integrated social development across Africa.

As we advance, SDEP remains dedicated to transparency and inclusivity, ensuring that all stakeholders are engaged in the process. This commitment is vital for fostering trust and collaboration among communities, government entities, and international partners. By focusing on collective action, SDEP aspires to create a robust network of support that empowers individuals and communities alike.
